→ Multi-Stage Value Chain

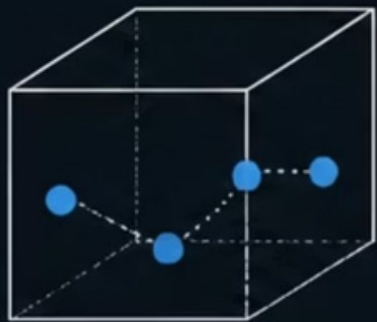

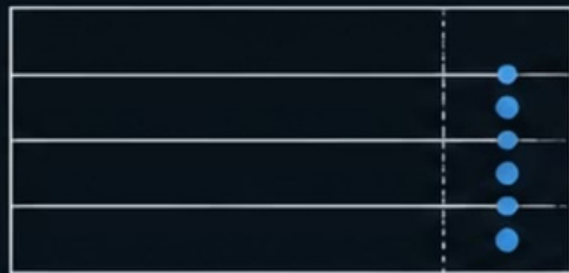

CHAPTER 1

What Is a Dairy-Specific ERP?

Dairy ERP vs. Generic ERP

Generic ERP platforms are built for broad applicability across industries. While they cover core business functions, they lack the domain-specific modules that dairy operations critically require. A dairy-specific ERP, by contrast, is engineered around the actual workflows of the industry.

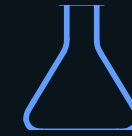


Core Modules of a Dairy ERP Platform



Milk Procurement

Automated recording of milk collection from multiple sources, with fat and SNF testing integration and route-wise aggregation.



Quality & Lab Management

End-to-end quality testing workflows from raw milk intake through finished goods, with non-conformance tracking and certification support.



Production Planning

Dynamic production scheduling, Bill of Materials management with variable yields, and batch-wise production orders.



Lot Traceability

Complete forward and backward traceability from raw milk source to finished product batch, enabling rapid recall management.



Sales & Distribution

Route planning, daily order management, delivery scheduling, returnable empties tracking, and customer billing automation.



Finance & Accounts

Integrated GL, accounts payable/receivable, farmer payment processing, and real-time P&L by product line or plant.

Milk Procurement Management

The procurement module is the nerve centre of any dairy ERP. Every morning, hundreds or thousands of collection points feed raw milk into the supply chain. Without automation, tracking quantities, quality, and payments across this network is error-prone and labour-intensive.

Multi-Source Collection

Record procurement from individual farmers, milk collection centres (MCCs), cooperative societies, and bulk chilling centres on a single platform.

Fat & SNF-Based Pricing

Automatically calculate milk prices based on fat percentage, Solids-Not-Fat (SNF), and quality grade using configurable price slabs.

Route & Shift Management

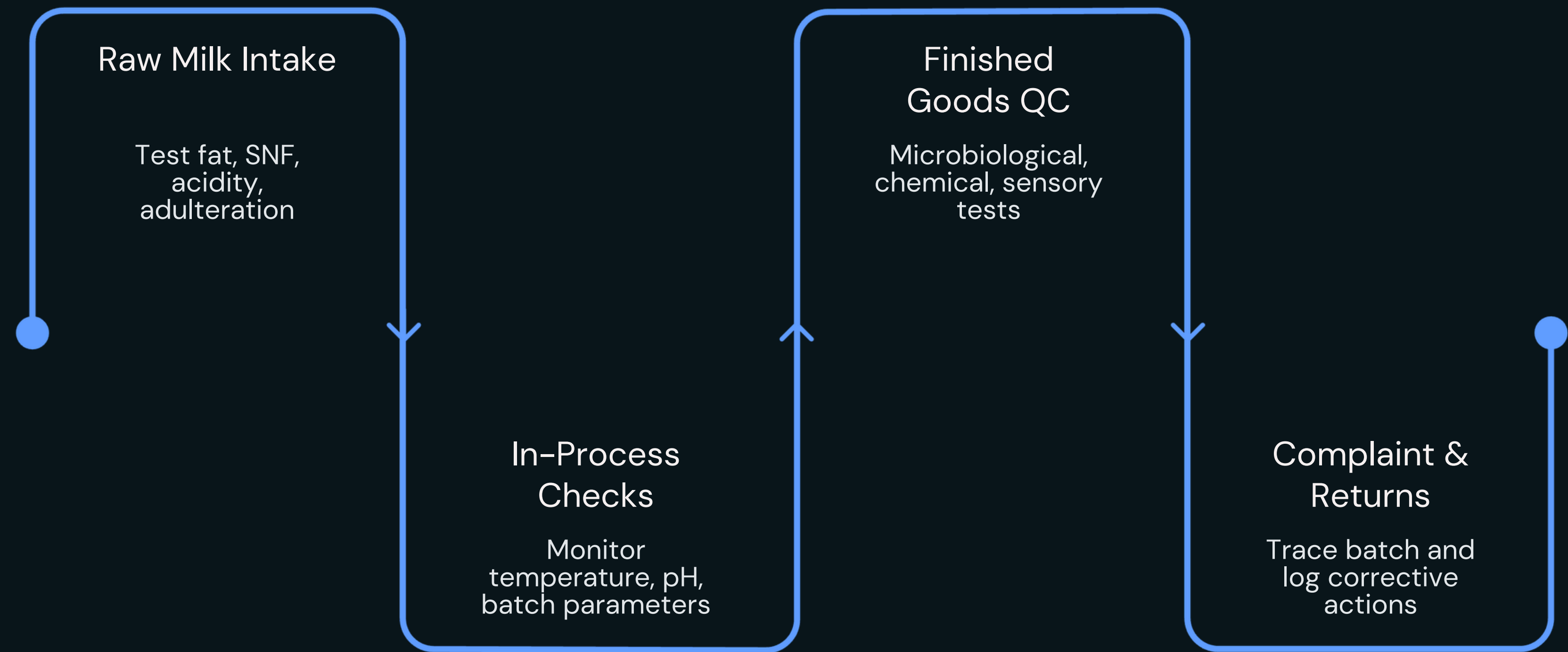
Track morning and evening shift collections route-wise, with exception alerts for missed collections or quality deviations.

Automated Farmer Payments

Generate accurate farmer payment statements with incentives, deductions, and advance recovery — reducing disputes and building trust.

Quality Control & Lab Management

In dairy, quality is not just a business imperative — it is a regulatory and public health requirement. A dairy ERP must embed quality checkpoints at every stage of the supply chain, not treat QC as an afterthought module.



This end-to-end quality chain ensures that every litre of milk and every unit of finished product meets defined standards before reaching the consumer, while maintaining complete audit trails for regulatory compliance.

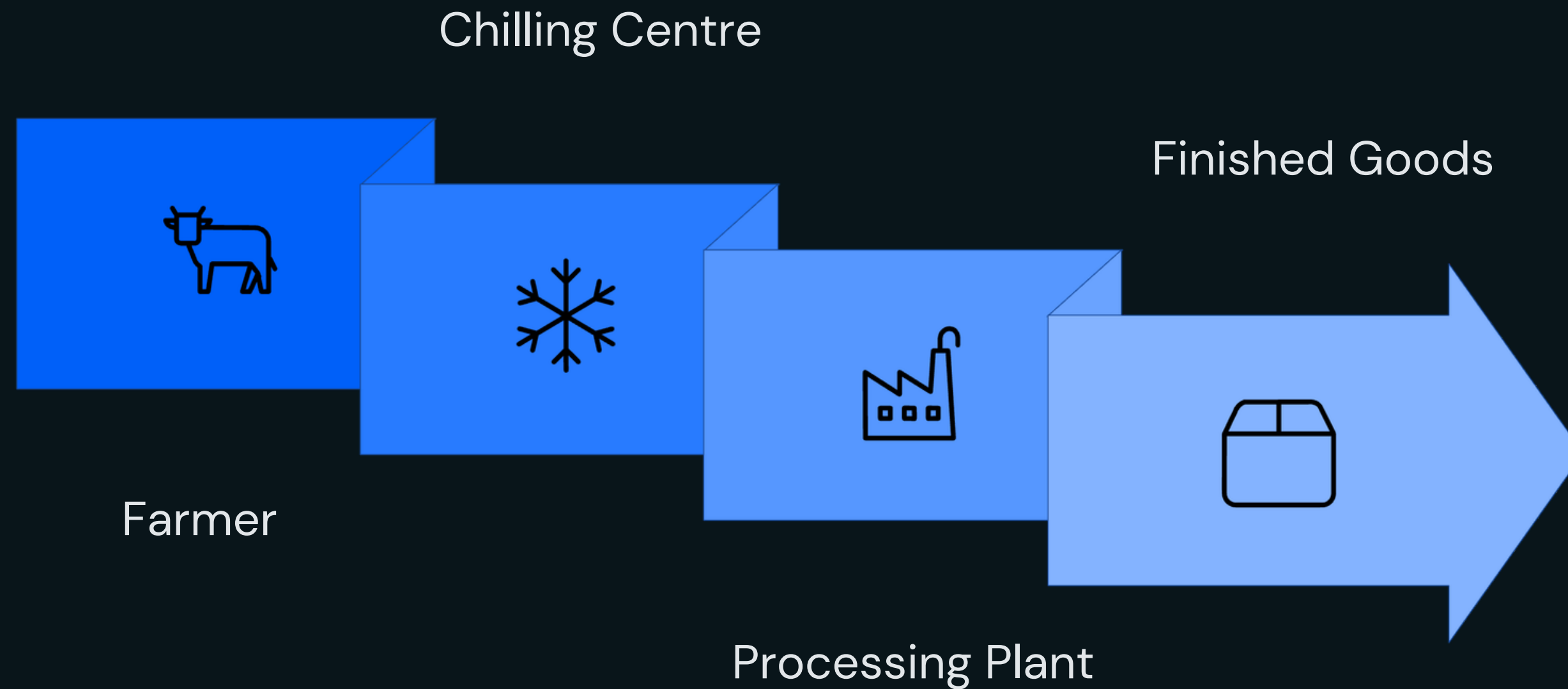

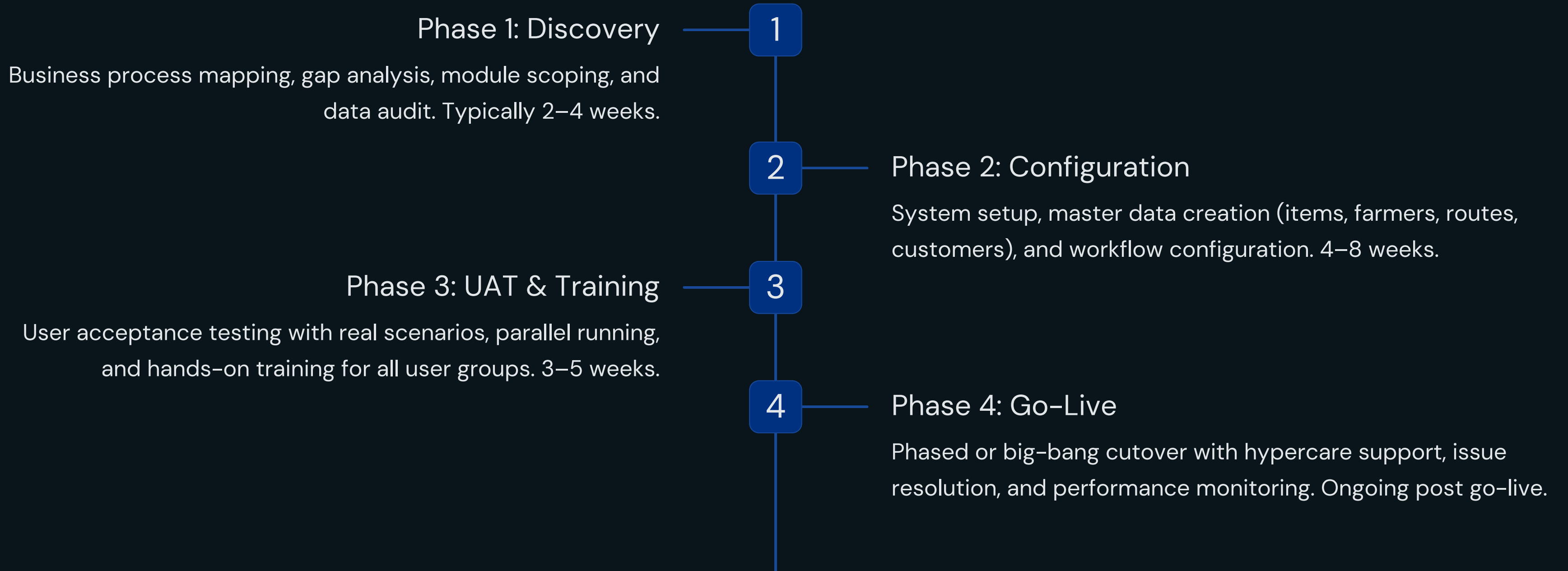

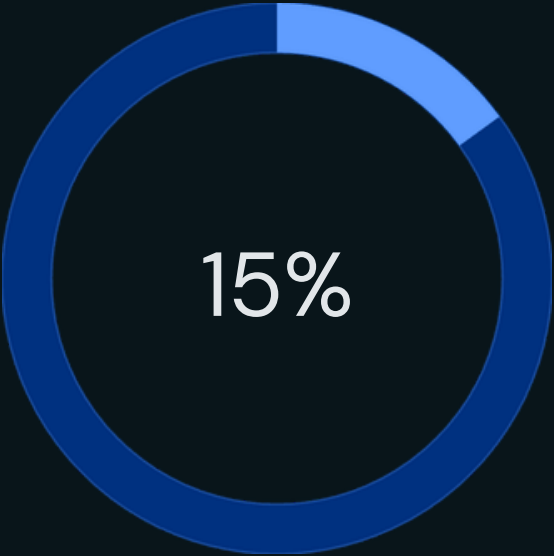
Typical ERP Implementation Journey



Most mid-size dairy businesses achieve full deployment within 3–4 months. Larger enterprises with multiple plants may require 6–9 months for a phased rollout.

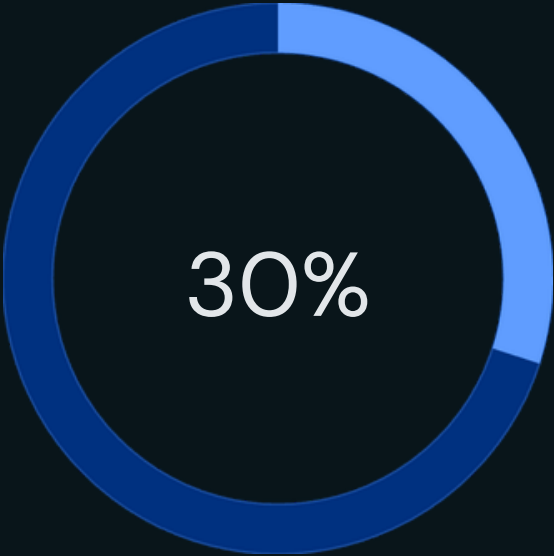
